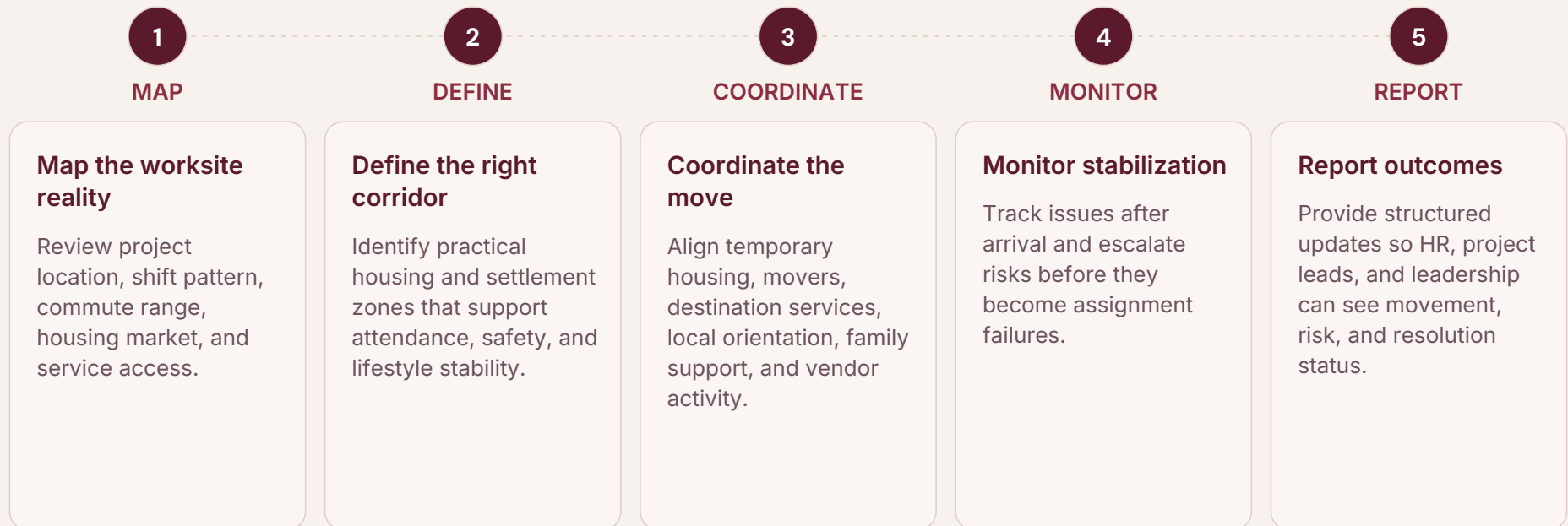

End-to-End Relocation Management

One accountable partner across the full mobility lifecycle.

01 Assignment readiness & stabilization

Move employees from “just arrived” to “work-ready” through targeted housing, settlement, local integration, and family support.

02 Strategic corridor alignment

Map housing, commute patterns, schools, services, and community access within defined Work Corridors to reduce fatigue and improve retention.

03 Family & non-work barrier support

Manage spouse transitions, childcare or caregiver logistics, school placement, local services, and practical settlement needs.

04 Policy-driven deployment

Administer client-specific relocation policies with attention to scope, timeline, budget, approval pathways, and program consistency.

05 Vendor coordination

Coordinate temporary housing, movers, real estate support, destination services, transportation partners, and local providers through one channel.

06 Reporting & escalation

Structured updates, issue tracking, and escalation pathways so stakeholders can act quickly and confidently.

Infrastructure corridor deployment

Supported 40+ technical staff and accompanying families into a major transportation corridor for a multi-year infrastructure project. Housing and local support were aligned to shift schedules, commute expectations, and safety requirements.

Coordinated policy-driven moves for a national head-office consolidation, stabilizing key managers within targeted commute zones and reducing disruption during the transition period.

Cross-border specialist placements

Managed international moves into Canadian project hubs for specialist roles, including family settlement, school placement, spousal support, and housing constraints connected to immigration timelines.

CASE 04

Remote site ramp-up

Delivered rapid housing and deployment support for a time-sensitive project in a constrained rental market, using a blend of temporary housing and staged permanent placements.

Seasonal workforce mobility

Structured repeatable corridor-based housing and transportation support for recurring seasonal talent, improving attendance and reducing early exits across back-to-back project cycles.

Cleaner accountability

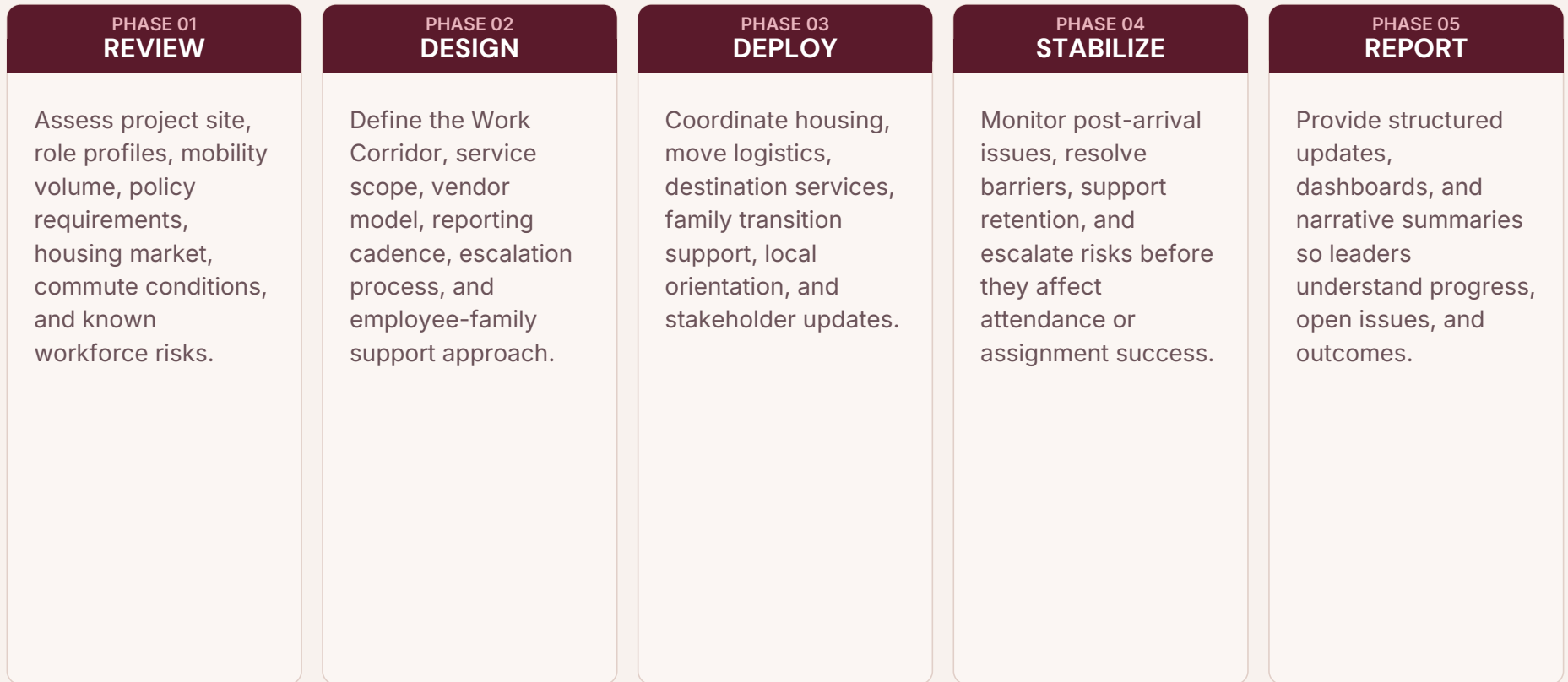
